- 3. **RMR CAF Familiarization Activity.** The Squadron been invited to participate in a joint activity with 2806 Pointe-Claire and 2862 Westmount on Saturday, February 8 at the Royal Montreal Regiment. This activity is open to all Level 3 5 Cadets. Cadets will be spending the day learning about the history of the Regiment, the weapons soldiers typically handle and get a chance to learn how to handle and then virtual shoot with the C-7 Rifle using the Canadian Forces Small Arms Trainer. Cadets can sign up through the closed Facebook Group.
- 4. **RMR Cadet Mess Dinner and Dance.** Cadets with the rank of Flight Corporal or higher are eligible to attend a Mess Dinner and Dance at the Royal Montreal Regiment Armoury on Saturday, February 8, 2020. - 17. **Name Tags**. Cadets are required to wear nametags when in uniform. Cadets can purchase name tags through the Parent's Committee at a cost of \$3.50 per name tag.
- 18. **Air Cadet Field Training Uniform (Combats) Update**. All FTUs have been ordered. We hope to have them ready for distribution to our Cadets by the end of the month.

Part 6 – Announcements and Items of General Interest

19. **Cadet Guide Update.** There have been several changes to regulations that have been announced in recent months. A revision of the Squadron's Cadet Guide is currently being undertaken to ensure that the information in the cadet guide is in line with these changes. Until this revision is complete, if there is a conflict between what has been announced in Monthly Routine Orders and what is in the Cadet Guide, the information in Monthly Routine Orders will take precedence.

- 20. **Lord Strathcona Medal Applications.** Cadets interested in applying for the Lord Strathcona Medal have until 2359 hours on March 17, 2020 to submit a completed Application Form and a 500 1000 word narrative to the Training Officer, 2Lt Bigras-Dewan. The narrative must clearly articulate how they exemplify the model cadet and how they maintain a high level of physical fitness. Application forms can be downloaded from the Squadron Website at https://www.588aircadets.com/reference-library or a paper copy can be requested from the Administration department. Cadets must also meet the basic requirements which will be verified during the selection process using the applicant's information in Fortress:
 - a. Successfully completed the Level 3 training program;
 - b. Attended at least 75% of the scheduled training parades this year;
 - c. Attended at least 50% of the scheduled optional activities this year; and
 - d. Completed three years as a cadet.
- 21. **Royal Canadian Legion Medal of Excellence Applications.** Cadets interested in applying for this medal have until 2100 hours on March 17, 2020 to submit a completed Application Form and a 500 1000 word narrative to the Training Officer, 2Lt Bigras-Dewan. Application forms can be downloaded from the Squadron Website at https://www.588aircadets.com/reference-library or a paper copy can be requested from the Administration department. The narrative must clearly articulate how they exemplify the model cadet and how they have enhanced the squadron through one or more of the following:
 - 1) Cooperation with peers and subordinates;
 - 2) Comradeship;
 - 3) Promotion of goodwill and morale;
 - 4) Efforts to develop group identity and cohesiveness;
 - 5) Support and assistance given to fellow cadets; and
 - 6) Involvement in the local community.

Cadets must also meet the basic requirements which will be verified during the selection process using the applicant's information in Fortress:

- a. Must have completed Level 2 training program; and
- b. Must have completed at least 1 year as a Cadet.
- 22. **National Air Cadet Scholarships & Bursaries**. Cadets interested in applying for this year's national scholarships have until 2100 hours on March 17, 2020 to submit their application package to the Deputy Commanding Officer (DCO), Captain Whittall. The Application form can be downloaded from the Squadron Website at https://www.588aircadets.com/reference-library or a paper copy can be requested from the Administration department. Cadets will questions are asked to speak with the DCO. This year, the following opportunities are available to our cadets:

CHANGE IN ORDERED NUMBER OF DRESS

1. The dress regulations for all Sea, Army and Air Cadets has been replaced by one national set of dress instructions for all cadets. This has resulted in a change in the numbers associated with each order of dress. There are three numbered orders of dress that are worn regularly at our Squadron. Below is an outline of these orders of dress with their new numbers. NUMBER C-1A CEREMONIAL DRESS



This standard of dress is worn year-round for special ceremonies/parades and for Commanding Officer's Parades normally held on the last Tuesday of every month.

This standard of dress consists of the following: Wedge, shirt, tie, jacket with belt, trousers, belt, boots, socks, medals (if awarded them), pins, name tag and cloth pilot/glider badge (if awarded them).

Cadets holding certain parade appointments may be authorized to wear lanyards and white webbing or white gloves at the discretion of the Commanding Officer.

NUMBER C-3B SERVICE DRESS



This standard of dress normally worn at the Squadron for most routine training activities from September to mid-October and mid-March to June.

This standard of dress consists of the following: Wedge, Shirt, Rank Slip-ons, trousers, belt, boots, socks, ribbons (if awarded them), pins, name tag and metal pilot/glider wings (if awarded them).

NUMBER C-3E SERVICE DRESS



This standard of dress normally worn at the Squadron for most routine training activities from mid-October until mid-March (depending on the temperature).

This standard of dress consists of the following: Wedge, blue t-shirt, jacket with belt, trousers, belt, boots, socks, ribbons (if awarded them), pins, name tag and cloth pilot/glider badge (if awarded them).
